With today´s online data, **approximately 18,2 million entries** are now available for the currently 39,600 registered users.

In the Casualty Lists you will find the wounded, prisoners of war, and the fallen from all member countries of the Habsburg Monarchy. In total, there will be approximately 3 to 3,5 million entries. You will find offices,

one-year volunteers, and, naturally, the whole gang with all confessions, this, also Jewish, Muslim and Protestant soldiers.

approximately 234,000 new entries

Of the now approximately 3,78 million church records from the Dioceses Passau about 440,000 are marriages (now complete), about 1,77 million are baptisms, and the remainder are deaths.

In this database you will find parish, volumes, page numbers, Last Names, First Names, date/year or records, not always profession, as well as address/town. You will find the church registers of the Dioceses Passau at www.matricula-online.eu. You will also find a table listing all parishes with updated time frames and important tips under Hilfe/Info (Help/Information).

3 New: the owner of houses in Upper Austria

Herbert Mandaurek made a handwritten listing of houseowners of Upper Austria between 1938 and 1943. This database was created from these handwritten listing which is stored in the Upper Austrian Archives. It contains about 92.500 entries of surname, given name, community, house names (vulgo name), profession, location and housenumber.
